In the ever-changing world of country music, Mark Chesnutt is an artist who has stayed true to his roots. With a love of classic country that dates back to his early years, Chesnutt's commitment to preserving a traditional sound has earned him countless awards and record sales over the last three decades.

Chesnutt burst onto to the Nashville music scene in 1990 with his first single "Too Cold At Home" and quickly established himself as one of the most authentic vocalists of the era. His reception of the CMA Horizon Award in 1993 was foreshadowing of a longstanding career as one of the genre's most reliable performers.

The Beaumont, Texas native cranked out 14 No. 1 hits and

23 top ten singles in the years following, including "Bubba Shot The Jukebox," "It Sure Is Monday," "I'll Think of Something," "Going Through The Big D" and more. One of the biggest hits of his career, "I Don't Want To Miss A Thing," spent four consecutive weeks at the top of the charts.

Although Chesnutt enjoys the career highlights of number one singles and platinum record sales, he most values being on the road, playing live shows in the clubs and honky-tonks where he got his start. Still known as one of the industry's hardest-working performers, Chesnutt is dedicated to delivering live music to his loyal fan base, to whom he credits his success.

With Summer 2016 came the release of a new album from Mark Chesnutt. The aptly titled Tradition Lives consists of 12 songs that, although brand new, still possess the classic quality Chesnutt fans have come to expect from his music.
